Aluminum foil trays & wrap

Boxboard, cereal, tissue, detergent-type boxes and egg cartons

Cans, food and beverage, aerosol and paint

Corrugated cardboard

Drinking boxes, milk & juice cartons

Glass bottles and jars

Paper, newspaper, junk mail, envelopes, magazines and books (hard & soft cover)

Plastic containers - rigid plastic. Check containers for recyclable symbols 1 through 7.

Plastic grocery & shopping bags

All containers - empty, rinse and place loose in blue box

Baked goods - e.g. bread, cookies, dough

Butcher paper

Butter and margarine

Candy

Cereal

Dairy products - e.g. cheese, sour cream

Coffee filters, grounds

Corn cobs, husks

Eggs, eggshells

Facial tissues

Fish, fish parts

Flour and sugar bags

Fruit

Fur

Grains and rice

Gravy and sauces

Grease, lards, fats

Jams and jellies

Meat, meat products, bones
