

## THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE

The City of Cambridge is committed to supporting the restoration and redevelopment of contaminated sites throughout the City in order to encourage sustainable and economically-successful opportunities. Since 1998, more than 400 residential units and 9,000 square meters of commercial and institutional space have been built on remediated brownfields in the downtown core areas, and three of these projects have been recognized with a Canadian Urban Institute "Brownie Award".



In addition to brownfield incentives offered in partnership with the Region of Waterloo, the City of Cambridge offers financial incentive programs that help to reduce the costs of site remediation:

- Development Charges Exemption (Core Areas)
- Planning Fee Exemptions (Core Areas)
- Contaminated Sites Grant Program (Core Areas)
- Tax Increment Grant (TIG) Program (City-Wide)
