### Municipal Class Environmental Assessment

#### Iron Horse Trail to Future Transit Hub Active Transportation Connection

The Region of Waterloo is undertaking a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) study to improve the cycling and walking connection between the Iron Horse Trail and the future Transit Hub at the intersection of Victoria Street and King Street in the City of Kitchener. The study is being conducted as a "Schedule B" Environmental Assessment (EA) in accordance with the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

The Region is holding a Public Consultation Centre (PCC) to introduce the study and present different alternative routes that have been developed and evaluated by the project team.

The PCC will be an opportunity to:

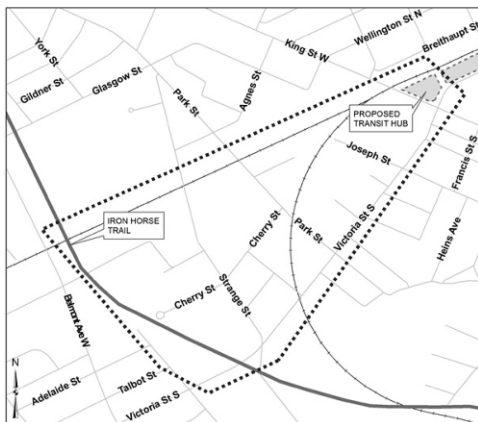
- Learn of the alternative routes;
