



William Street Water Supply System Upgrades Notice of Project Initiation

Region of Waterloo

The Region of Waterloo (Region) will start detailed design of the William Street Water Supply Systems (WSS) upgrades as per the recommendations from the 2016 Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA).

The project will include the construction of a new well house, drilling a new well, removal of the existing reservoir and well houses, and decommissioning of equipment in the existing pumping station. On project completion, water from the William Street WSS will be conveyed to the Strange Street Water Treatment Plant for treatment.

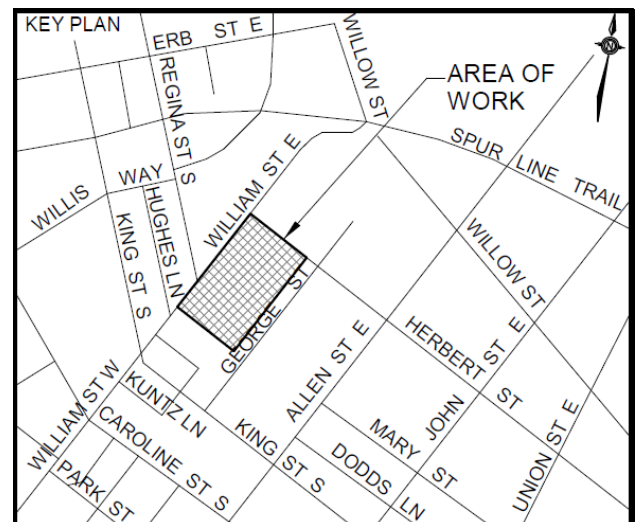
What is the purpose of this project?
