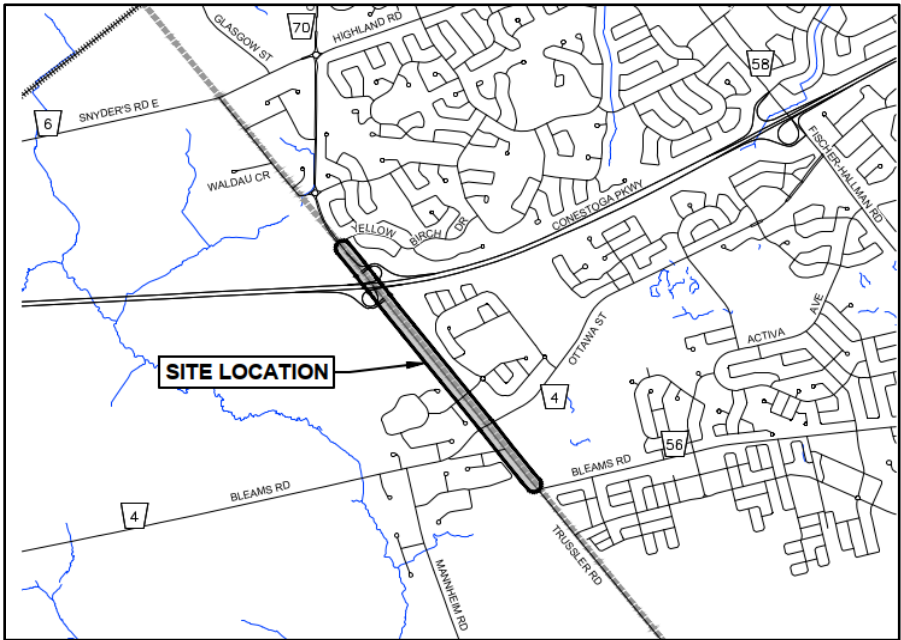
Trussler Road (Regional Road 70) Improvements

Municipal Class Environmental Assessment, Schedule 'C'

The Region of Waterloo is undertaking a Schedule 'C' Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) for improvements to the Trussler Road corridor from Bleams Road to Yellow Birch Drive in the City of Kitchener and Township of Wilmot.



This study is being completed to identify the preferred solution for upgrading this section of Trussler Road to address the long-term needs for improved traffic operations, underground infrastructure, and new pedestrian and cycling facilities. This study will be completed in accordance with the requirements of the Class EA process, dated October 2000 (amended 2023), and will consider potential social, economic, and environmental impacts, and appropriate measures to prevent or mitigate these impacts.

The Region and its consultant for this study, Associated Engineering (Ont.) Ltd., will be seeking public input on known issues, opportunities for improvements, and the findings of this study.
