Study/Project Scope (What & Why)

Westmount Road and Victoria Street are fully urbanized 4-lane roadways and the adjacent properties include a combination of residential, commercial, institutional and public uses, including the City of Kitchener's Victoria Hills Community Centre, Gzowski Park, Monarch Woods Park and Filsinger Park / Henry Sturm Greenway. Both Westmount Road and Victoria Street are identified in the Region's Transportation Corridor Design Guidelines as "Neighborhood Connectors (Avenue)" and are to be supportive of active transportation and transit. These roadways act as the primary transportation corridors in the area, provide transit service for many residents in the adjacent neighborhoods and accommodate approximately 40,000 vehicles on a daily basis.

The existing roadway asphalt is in fair to poor condition and in need of rehabilitation or replacement. The Region's approved 2017 Transportation Capital Program (TCP) currently includes funding for road improvements on Westmount Road and Victoria Street for the rehabilitation of roadways, sidewalk replacement, traffic signal modernizations, illumination and pedestrian refuge islands, as well as replacement of sections of watermain and sewers on behalf of the City of Kitchener. The rehabilitation of the roadways also provides an opportunity to consider the installation of cycling facilities on these sections of Westmount Road and Victoria Street, both of which are designated on-road cycling routes in the Region's Active Transportation Master Plan; therefore enhanced facilities for pedestrians and cyclists are being considered as part of this project.
