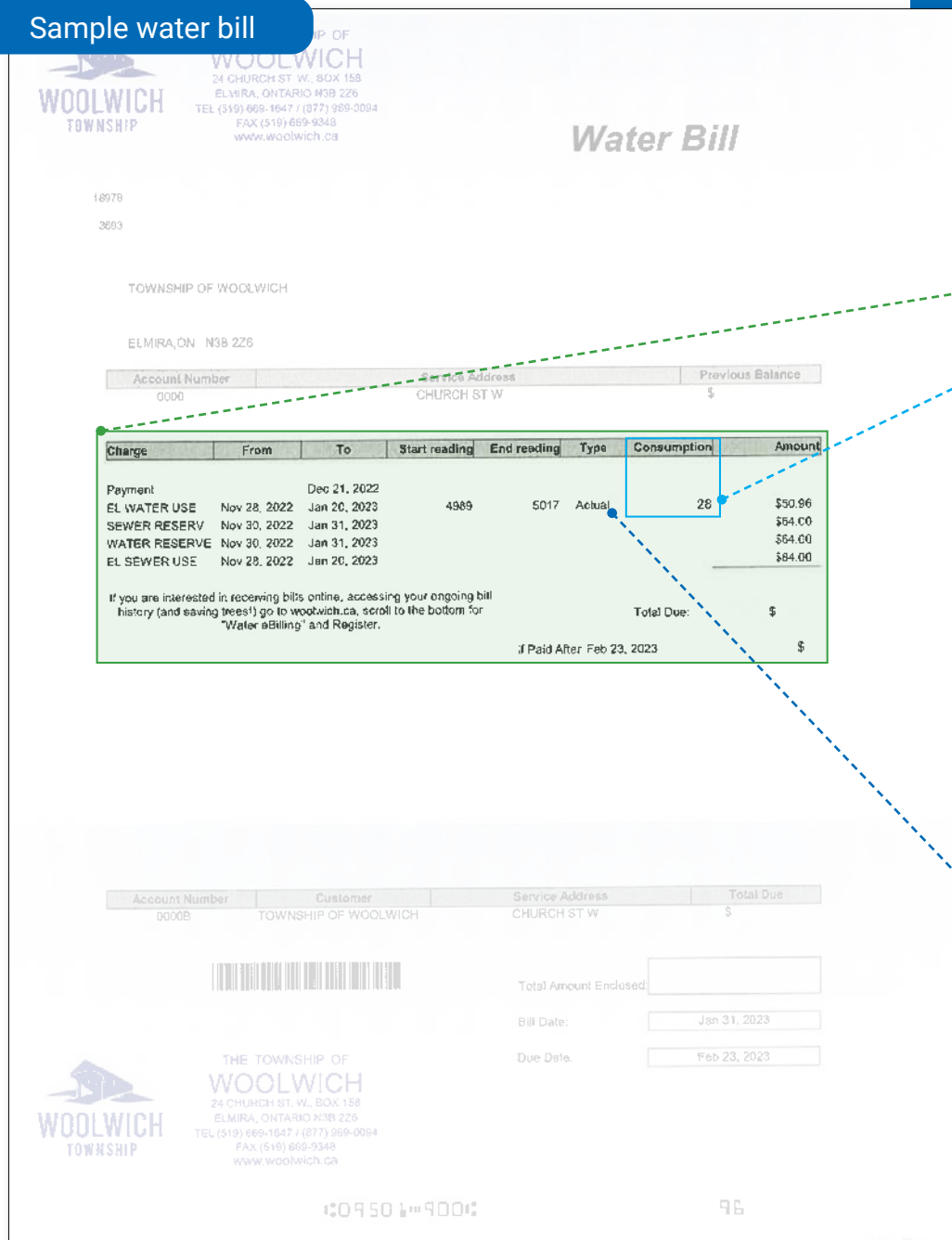


How to read your water bill



1 Find the water section of your bill

2 View your total consumption

Your total consumption is your water use represented in cubic meters (m³). 1 m³ = 1000 litres of water.

3 Compare your consumption

To compare your household water use to the regional average, take your total consumption in cubic meters and divide by the number of people in your home. Divide this number by two to get your monthly water usage. Compare this number to the chart below.

Number of people in home	Average water use per month	
	4.5 m ³	4,500 L
	9 m ³	9,000 L
	13.5 m ³	13,500 L
	18 m ³	18,000 L
	22.5 m ³	22,500 L

If you see an estimated reading on your water bill it means that the actual reading was unattainable at the time and will be read and updated on the next water bill. Estimated readings are based on your water use history.

Monitor your consumption history for any abnormal jumps in water use. An increase may indicate changes in water use behaviours, a leaking toilet flapper, outdoor watering etc.
