



Notice of Study Completion Baden and New Hamburg Water and Wastewater System Servicing Review



The Region of Waterloo (Region) initiated a Servicing Review to assess the current water and wastewater systems in the communities of Baden, New Hamburg and Foxboro Green and assess current and future needs. The following recommended improvements have been selected to address the needs within the Region:

1. Upgrade the Baden Pump Station and construct a new forcemain connecting directly to the New Hamburg Wastewater Treatment Plant
2. Connect Foxboro Green to the Baden sewer and water supply system

This Servicing Review was completed in accordance with the requirements of Schedule B projects, following Phases 1 and 2 of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (October 2000, as amended in 2007, 2011 and 2015), which is an approved process under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

In addition, a request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order requiring a higher level of study (i.e., requiring an individual/comprehensive EA approval before being able to proceed), or that conditions be imposed (e.g., require further studies), only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate, or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered. Requests should include the requester contact information and full name for the ministry.

Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for additional conditions or a request for an individual/comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate, or remedy those potential adverse impacts, and any information in support of the statements in the request. This will ensure that the ministry is able to

efficiently begin reviewing the request. The request should be sent in writing or by email to the Region of Waterloo and to:

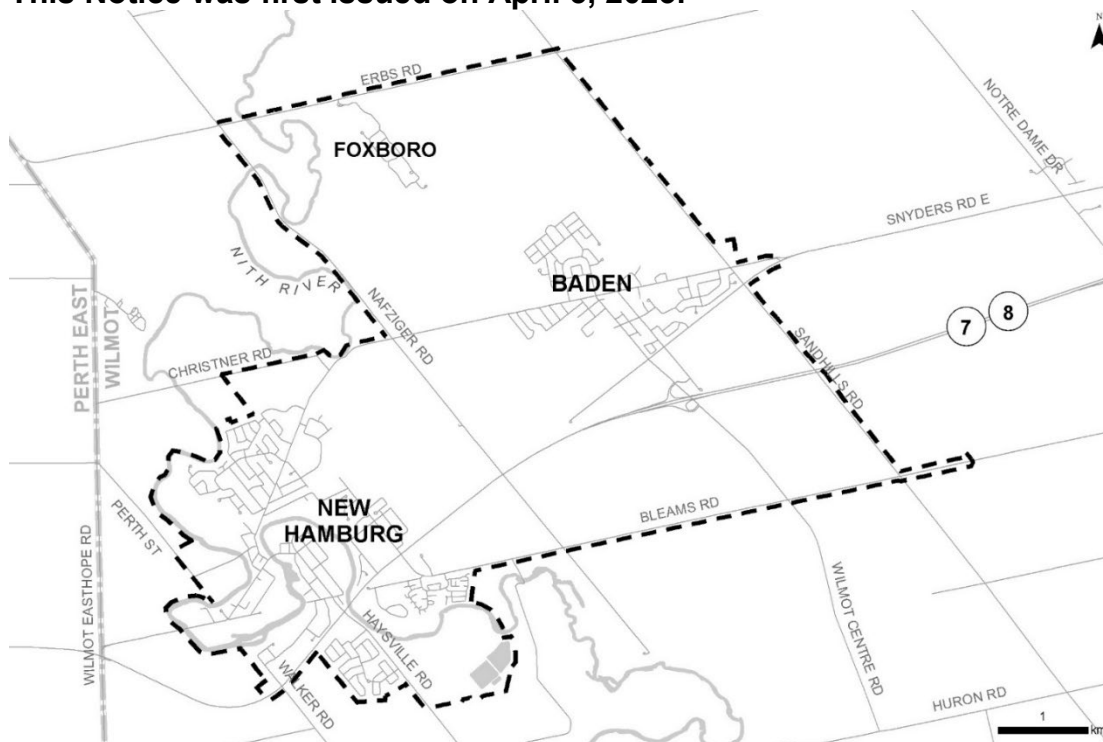
