Notice of Completion

Wellesley Water and Wastewater Master Plan

The Region of Waterloo has completed a Water and Wastewater Master Plan (WWWMP) for the Village of Wellesley. The study was completed as a Master Plan under Approach #2 of the Municipal Engineers Association's (MEA) Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) process (MEA 2000, as amended 2007, 2011, 2015, 2023, 2024). This process is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. With the completion of this study, the Region may move forward with implementing the projects identified in the plan.

The WWWWMP outlines recommended water and wastewater infrastructure improvements needed to support the community's needs to the year 2051. The plan focuses on providing practical, affordable, and achievable solutions to support future growth, manage infrastructure risks, and meet regulatory requirements, using municipal and environmental planning practices.

Public review of the Master Plan
